- Emergency signal service direct to Fair Haven Police radios
- Upgraded our internal radio communications equipment
- Have hosted multiple drills with neighboring law enforcement
- Have hosted multiple NJ Department of Education/County Prosecutor audits of our security procedures

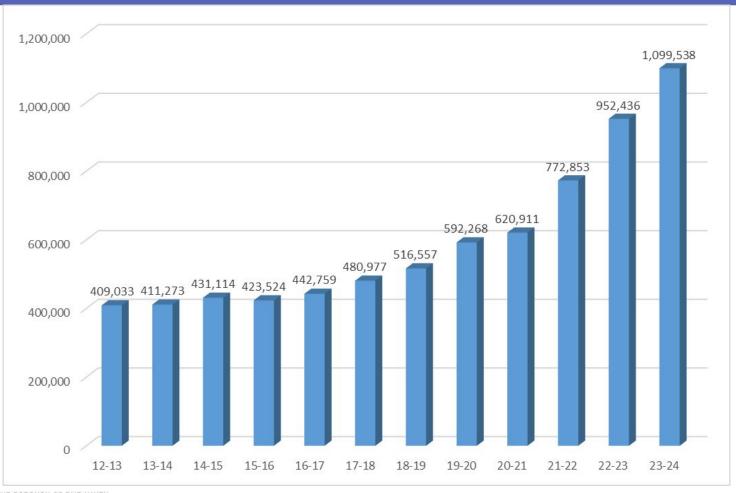

### State Aid 2023-2024

- Governor's Proposed Budget calls for a \$147,102 increase in state aid.
- Continuing on the path to full funding under the S2 legislation. 2025 is the target year.
- •Still a very small percentage of our overall budget (6.2%)

### What's in this budget?

- Investment in our students & staff:
  - Keeping staff on scale for salaries/benefits



- \$850,000 increase in four years
- 8.5% average yearly increase



### What's in this budget?

- Investment in our students & staff:
  - Adding new staff:
    - Supervisor Special Services (Prof serv to FTE position)
    - BCBA replacement from 2021-2022 (\$55k)
    - Additional Guidance Counselor (Gr 3-5) (\$55k)
    - Additional Preschool Teacher (\$55k)
    - Additional security personnel in the Schools (shared service Borough)
      (\$45k)
    - Part Time Chinese Teacher (shared service RFH) (\$22k)
    - Additional support for Media Literacy & Gifted & Talented (\$13k)
    - Math Interventionist Gr 6-8 (\$55k)
  - Curricular support for Science/Math/Assessments (+60k)



### What's in this budget?

- Increase in support of permanent and daily substitute staff members
- Keep part-time KG Aides in place via ARP ESSER for 23-24
- (6) 2nd grade sections (move up from 1st)
- Support, professional development, and resources for social emotional learning and mental health- General Fund and ARP ESSER Federal Grant
- Reserve projects (\$200,000):
  - Knollwood parking lot repair and restriping
  - Science classroom update 332 Knollwood
  - Condenser repair/replacement in a couple of rooftop units
  - Landscaping
  - Bathroom 300 wing Knollwood
  - Continue sports field reconditioning (Field Hockey, Sportsman's)

## What savings are in this budget?

- Continuing shared services (Supervision for building and grounds)
- Salary Breakage (a few retirements/separations)
  - Replacements at step 1 on the guide, (-\$113k).
- Departmentalized Social Studies (-\$78k).
- Instructional Aid reassignments (-\$66k)
- Copier lease savings (-\$15k)

- •Fair Haven consistently has one of the lowest per pupil costs for total education spending in the County and the State. 1<sup>st</sup> in the County (54 districts) at \$20,517 for the latest data (20-21 actual).
- Admin costs 3rd in the County for lowest admin per pupil (21-22 budgeted)
- Other TGES categories are favorable as well
